ABOUT EIFF

The Edmonton International Film Festival Society (EIFFS) is a non-profit, charitable organization governed by a volunteer Board of Directors whose mandate is to present a multi-day film festival that showcases independent cinema from around the world in Edmonton movie-theatres. The annual schedule includes 40+ feature-length dramas and documentaries, dozens of short films, and welcomes up to 50 filmmaker guests who participate in audience Q&A.

Despite the state of the world these days, more than 2,000 films were submitted to this year's EIFF—compare that with 100 in 2003 and 800 in 2010. Proof that our unique brand of film festival is resonating with filmmakers who have been here and are spreading the word about EIFF to their peers. Our commitment to honoring film MAKERS and celebrating what they do, continues to set our festival apart. We are told time and again that this kind of care for filmmakers is rarely expressed by film festivals in general, and it makes us genuine.

Through the cinematic voices that we present, it is our hope that audiences achieve a better understanding of communities outside of their own. Film festivals certainly offer a unique perspective on the world! And, we have to be creative about how we entice filmmakers to come to Edmonton. As noted above, our approach has been to create a festival that is about the film MAKERS. We focus on directors, writers, producers, short films, creators in (and from) our own province, Canadiana and international, cinematic storytellers. Every guest to EIFF is given our unique version of "star" treatment

and when they go to their next festival, or back to their families, they talk about Edmonton and our audiences who appreciate, and support, independent film.

Outside of the festival dates—in March—EIFFS presents the OSCAR® NOMINATED Short Films in these three (3) categories: LIVE ACTION, ANIMATION and DOCUMENTARY. Programmed the week before the Academy Awards are televised, audiences can enjoy ALL of the nominees in three (3) categories—when's the last time you could say that about any of the other categories?

The next Academy Awards take place on MARCH 12, 2023. Watch for the OSCAR® NOMINATED Short Films in the atres MARCH 6 to 11

ABOUT EIFF

EIFF IS AN OSCAR® QUALIFYING FESTIVAL

In 2016, EIFF earned status as an OSCAR® Qualifying Festival in two (2) of the short film categories—ANIMATION and LIVE ACTION. This means that the EIFF Grand Jury winners in each of those categories can submit their short film to the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences (AMPAS) for OSCAR® consideration. EIFF is the final OSCAR® Qualifier in the calendar year. Once submitted, the Academy then announces a short list of the Top 10 films in each category. Then... it's the announcement of ALL the nominees—typically 6 short films per category.

APRIL 25, 2021. OSCAR® Night! Our fingers and toes are crossed for Director/Writers Will McCormack and Michael Govier. Their short. IF ANYTHING HAPPENS I LOVE YOU, is up for OSCAR®! We are over the moon. "Edmonton gave us our OSCAR® wings" savs Will McCormack in a ZOOM call with EIFF organizers just one (1) week before the live awards ceremony. Michael Govier chimes in with "Edmonton was the one that we won, and that qualified us. And you get this great letter, and then the Academy says, 'You are qualified to submit.' Edmonton, they lit the fuse that began the train, so we're very grateful. This is why film festivals are so important." The 12-minute short is available on Netflix CONGRATULATIONS Michael and Will. We are SO proud to have 'lit the fuse' to your OSCAR® journey!

Adam and Ida were three years old when they were separated during the Holocaust. Adam survived a concentration camp and was later adopted. Ida survived the war hidden by a Polish couple. Both children were baptized, issued a fake birth certificate with new names and grew up Catholic. It seemed all but impossible that they would ever reunite. However, the twins always felt "something missing". Following a 53-year long journey that took them around the globe, one day Ida believes to recognize her brother on a newspaper photo resembling her grandfather. When the two strangers meet, they are convinced to have found each other at last—"We know it is us", says Ida. Is it a happy ending? Can history be overcome? A stunning documentary about the strength of familial connection, and how it can cross time, space, and the strongest of adversity.

Jina is the top employee at a call center, but despite talking to customers all day, she has shut out the world beyond her headset; she lives alone, eats alone, sleeps alone, and her cell phone is her constant companion. When one day she's tasked with training a friendly and naive new hire, her icy armor is threatened. At the same time, she must navigate an incessantly ingratiating new neighbor, and increasingly urgent phone calls from her father, leaving Jina teetering on the edge of an existential crisis, forcing her to confront why she has isolated herself all these years.

Riffing on the Korean 'honjok'—a phenomenon of young people who live alone and skirt social interaction—to examine the personal traumas of loss and alienation, this subtly poetic directorial debut is a "stirring portrait of the cages we build for ourselves and questions how and when we may want to be free of them," (Ms. Magazine).

For too long cinema has been dominated by the male gaze. An insightful and revealing documentary feature, BODY PARTS shows the evolution of desire and "sex" on-screen from a female perspective—allowing women to reclaim the parts of themselves that have been objectified and exploited for decades—and features courageous, candid interviews with actors and creators who are advocating for real change, including Jane Fonda, Rosanna Arquette, Joey Soloway, Angela Robinson, Karyn Kusama, Rose McGowan, Alexandra Billings, Emily Meade, and David Simon.

BODY PARTS highlights the voices of women like Sarah Scott and Sarah Tither-Kaplan who bravely spoke out against abusive behavior on their sets, were punished for it, and who helped spark lasting improvements at major studios, including the groundbreaking introduction of intimacy coordinators. Director, Kristy Guevara-Flanagan, and producer, Helen Hood Scheer, deftly pair these interviews with clips from Hollywood's archives, to poignantly illustrate the emotional resonance of this sensitive topic.

From acclaimed Canadian director Marie Clements, BONES OF CROWS is a psychological drama told through the eyes of Cree Matriarch Aline Spears, as she survives Canada's residential school system to continue her family's generational fight in the face of systemic starvation, racism, and sexual abuse. She uses her uncanny ability to understand and translate codes into working for a special division of the Canadian Air Force as a Cree code talker in World War II. BONES OF CROWS unfolds over one hundred years, ambitiously following Aline's life from birth to old age, with a cumulative force that propels us into the future. Harrowing, timely, but most of all hopeful, BONES OF CROWS unflinchingly lays out history in front of us, and asks—where do we go from here?

Sang-hyun runs a laundry shop, but is constantly saddled with debt. Dong-soo, who grew up in an orphanage, works in a baby box facility. One night in the pouring rain, they secretly carry off an infant who was left at the baby box. But on the following day, the mother So-young unexpectedly returns for her son Woo-sung. Realizing that her baby has been taken, she is about to call the police when the two men tell her everything. REVIVAL69 tells the incredible back-door story of how-against all odds—a life-changing concert came together. The film reveals a series of colourful characters, murky deals and broken promises, culminating in John Brower, a young struggling promoter, putting his life on the line (literally) in order to achieve his goal. With dismal ticket sales. the concert was almost cancelled. But Brower took a one-in-a-million chance—inviting John Lennon, who astonishingly said yes—and it turned into a massively successful event. Included in the lineup were Chuck Berry, Little Richard, Jerry Lee Lewis, Bo Diddley, Gene Vincent, The Doors, Alice Cooper, and John Lennon with The Plastic Onos—his first appearance without the Beatles, the band included Yoko Ono, Eric Clapton. Klaus Voormann and Alan White. The film uses a priceless cinematic archive that includes unreleased concert footage from D.A. Pennebaker's original 16mm film, and a narrative primarily told through the eves of those who were there—the legends on stage, the mavericks behind the scenes, and members of the audience who witnessed history in the making.




